


Brown Bag Brigade and

While it seems each month in the newsletter when I give you the recap of a previous months' income and expenses, that we are running short, it does not tell the entire picture which I think you should all be aware of all the OTHER assets that we have that keep us going strong!

As of a few days ago our bank balance was approx. \$24 K. That is money in our checking account that is there to fill in for any shortfalls that each month might bring and includes several set aside funds for grants, capital improvements on the property, program expense and help in times of shortage. Now, while it would be great to have more coming in, we know in these economic hard times that everyone is supporting the church and its missions as best that it can and that is appreciated. God has seen this church through many hard times and always provided for us when we have needed it – we remain faithful that this will continue as we go forward in that faith to a new day as United In Grace!

Here is the latest treasurers report and it shows more income than expenses for the month, but that is due to the \$4900 back for Payroll Protection Loan that was not forgiven by the Gov that MUMC had to previously pay back, but was finally forgiven and repaid to us. We are still running short overall for the year.

Now, to a little more peace of mind for any of those who might doubt that we haven't the financial ability to continue, here's a little something that has been sitting in the church's Christmas stocking that I want you to be aware of – our investments. These are funds that are sitting in our investments accounts (managed by the UM Conference - recommended investments firm), but for our use. This is in addition to our bank account balance.

Cash reserve loan fund - Current Balance: \$17,578.81 funds we can "loan " to ourselves if needed for general expense

Pastoral housing Current Balance: \$13,164.84 should we ever have to provide pastoral housing again Endowment fund - Current Balance: \$53,038.52 previous bequests for specific things - will look at as UIG

Handicap access Current Balance: \$33,649.78 to be used specifically for this purpose


Capital improvements - Current Balance: \$88,350.37 - to be used for repair and maintenance of the property

As you can see, we will have a strong financial foundation coming in to this new church, along with what MSLC will bring, as we combine (see how much stronger we are together ??), and as long as we all work together to keep it that way, United in Grace will continue to be a church of people who gather together in strength and joy and hope to bring the love of our God out into a needy world in any way possible.

May the light of this blessed season shine within you all, on Christmas and every day to follow.
